

ROULETTE TECHNICAL STANDARDS

- ✓ BALL SPEED
The ball speed and wheel head speed must be varied each spin to ensure random decisions.
- ✓ WAVE OFF
Announce "NO MORE BETS" in a loud voice and "wave off" when there are 3 revolutions remaining. After this point, all late bets must be returned.
- ✓ BODY POSITION
After the wave off, position your body in such a manner that the entire layout can be seen and that your peripheral vision allows you to see into the wheel.
- ✓ PAYOFFS
Payoffs pushed out to the players must remain separate from their cheques so that the payoff is distinguishable.
- ✓ APPROVAL CALLS
Do not bring cheques in for color change or cash outs over ³⁰⁰\$100 without authorization from a supervisor.
- ✓ CLEARING HANDS
Always clear your hands with your palms up when leaving the game or before going to your body.

§ 107 . Limitations on exclusive rights: Fair use⁴⁰

- (4) the effect of the use upon the potential market for or value of the copyrighted work.

The fact that a work is unpublished shall not itself bar a finding of fair use if such finding is made upon consideration of all the above factors.
