Gaming Cheque Values

- ☒ The color of each gaming cheque tells us its value. A standard stack of gaming cheques is 20 units high:

Color	Value	Stack of 20
White	\$ 1.00	\$ 20.00
Red	\$ 5.00	\$ 100.00
Green	\$ 25.00	\$ 500.00
Black	\$ 100.00	\$ 2000.00
Purple	\$ 500.00	\$ 10,000.00
Yellow	\$ 1000.00	\$ 20,000.00
Brown	\$ 5000.00	\$ 100,000.00

Cutting Cheques

- ☒ Cut \$1, \$5, and \$100 cheques five (5) cheques high.

○ 1-5 = One stack ○ 6 = 3 and 3 ○ 7 = 3, 3 and 1 ○ 8 = 4 and 4 ○ 9 = 4, 4 and 1	○ 10 = 5 and 5 ○ 11 – 14 = 5, 5 and remainder ○ 15 = 5, 5 and 5 ○ 16-19 = 5, 5, 5 and remainder ○ 20 = 5, 5, 5 and 5
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- ☒ Cut \$25 and \$500 cheques four (4) cheques high.

○ 1-4 = One stack ○ 5 = 4 and 1 ○ 6 = 3, 3 ○ 7 = 3 and 3 and 1 ○ 8 = 4 and 4 ○ 9 – 11 = 4, 4 and remainder	○ 12 = 4, 4 and 4 ○ 13-15 = 4, 4, 4 and remainder ○ 16 = 4, 4, 4 and 4 ○ 17-19 = 4, 4, 4, 4 and remainder ○ 20 = 4, 4, 4, 4 and 4
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- ☒ Prove \$100 and larger cheques by splashing or breaking down last stack.

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
