Suits:

H: C: D: S = Hearts: Clubs: Diamonds: Spades

Spading the Deck: (in order) (Cards are spread from left to right) (always Ace on each end (Bottom -> top))

Hearts= A->K: Clubs = A->K: Diamonds= K->A: Spades= K->A

Shuffle:

(R=Riffle: B= Box: S= Strip)

(7 Step) (20 sec) (Cut card 10 cards in)

One deck:

Right side ½: R: B: S: R: B: R: cut

(10 Step) (30 Sec)(Cut card 26 cards in)

Two Deck:

Right side ½: Half: R: B: R: center: remaining cards: R: B: R: join: S: half: R: cut

(8 Step) (80Sec) (Cut card 52 cards in)

Six Deck

3 Stack: R: B: R: each: 1/3 stack: R: S: R: 1/3 stack: R: S: R: 1/3 stack: R: S: R: Call: Roll: pull: Cut

6:5 payout the easy way:

6:5 payout = bet x 2 dropping the last digit then add to base.

Example 1 \$10 bet: \$10 x 2 = \$20 Drop last digit making \$2 add to base makes \$10 + \$2 = \$12.00 payout
 Example 2 \$125 bet \$125 x 2 = \$250 Drop last digit making \$25 add to base making \$125 + \$25 = \$150 payout

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
