

THIRD CARD RULES

PLAYER RULES:

When First 2 Cards Total:	
0-1-2-3-4-5	Draws a Card
6 or 7	Stands
8 or 9	Stands (Natural)

BANKER RULES

When First 2 Cards Total	Draws when Player's 3rd card is	Stands when Player's 3rd card is
0-1-2	Always draws *	Always draws *
3	0-1-2-3-4-5-6-7-9	8
4	2-3-4-5-6-7	0-1-8-9
5	4-5-6-7	0-1-2-3-8-9
6	6-7	0-1-2-3-4-5-8-9
7	Stands	Stands
8-9	Stands (Natural)	Stands (Natural)

* Unless the player shows a *Natural* 8 or 9

If the player takes no cards, the banker must draw on 0-5 and stand on 6-9

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
